

SPECIAL OFFERING TODAY - Native American Ministry

An offering is taken on this Special Sunday to support vital ministries and churches in the Native American communities. The offering allows The United Methodist Church to partner with existing native ministries to develop new programs on behalf of Native Americans.

- Fifty percent of the funds collected on Native American Ministries Sunday remain in the Annual Conference to develop and strengthen Native American ministries in the conferences. To assist in developing these programs, each conference has a Committee on Native American Ministries (CONAM). These committees seek to advocate for ministry with and by Native Americans to share the diverse culture, history and traditions of Native peoples.
- Twenty-five percent of donations received fund designated scholarships for Native Americans attending United Methodist schools of theology. A significant shortage exists of Native American pastors and trained professionals and these scholarships provide development, implementation, and assessment of a higher education recruitment/retention for Native Americans.
- Twenty-five percent of the donations collected are used to create programs that allow the UMC to partner with existing native ministries to offer mentoring programs, peer support systems, funding for economic development projects, and restoring traditional and historic ways that bring forth new leaders for Native American communities.

GENERAL CONFERENCE

The United Methodist Church has no pope, but it does have a General Conference — the only body that can set official policy and speak for the international denomination, this includes making edits to The Book of Discipline. General Conference brings together lay and clergy delegates from across the globe whose decisions will affect how millions of United Methodists do church for years to come. Think of the twoweek gathering as a combination of a United Nations General Assembly, a U.S. congressional session and a time of rousing Christian worship. The coming General Conference, scheduled for April 23 - May 3 in Charlotte, North Carolina, comes at a particularly momentous time. General Conference typically gathers every four years, but because of the COVID pandemic, the assembly could not meet in 2020. That means the last regular session was in May 2016 — nearly eight years ago. In the interim, the denomination has seen a quarter of its U.S. churches depart under a disaffiliation policy that began in 2019 and expired at the end of 2023. To say we, as a denomination, as in a state of flux is a ridiculous understatement. Please be in prayer for the delegates, as they prepare to do the work of the church.

MEMBERSHIP AUDIT UNDERWAY

Members of First, Third Avenue, and Paris United Methodist Churches voted to merge into a new church called United Methodist Ministries of Mecosta County. While we celebrate the results of the merger vote, there is significant work to be done in order to facilitate this merger process. One of the major steps we need to take is to audit the membership of the three churches to find out who would like to be a member of the new church. When you receive your letter, with your Membership Audit Response Card, please take a minute to complete the card and send it back in the self-addressed return envelope.
