VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES FOR 2026

As we prepare for the year ahead, we're inviting you to consider a few simple but meaningful ways to serve our church family in 2026. These roles help us create spaces of welcome, connection, and worship every Sunday. Your participation strengthens our mission and supports the life of our community.

Fellowship Hosts - We are building the hosting schedule for Fellowship Time at the First Church Campus. Hosting can be done by individuals, families, or small groups and involves setting out light refreshments after worship. It's a great way to help create a warm, welcoming space for people to connect with one another.

Communion Stewards - Communion Stewards help prepare the elements for one of our most meaningful acts of worship. This ministry typically requires about an hour on Sunday morning, once a month or so, to set up the bread and cup, place items in the sanctuary, and ensure everything is ready for worship. It's a behind-the-scenes role that supports the whole congregation as we celebrate the sacrament together.

Greeters - Greeters are the first expression of hospitality people encounter once they step inside the building. A warm smile, a word of welcome, and a readiness to help someone find their way can make a profound difference. If you enjoy connecting with people and offering hospitality, this is a wonderful way to serve.

Ushers - Our ushers serve outside the sanctuary, handing out bulletins, assisting with seating as needed, and helping maintain a neat and tidy worship space before and after services. Ushers play an important role in helping worship flow smoothly and helping everyone feel at ease as they enter the sanctuary.



DARE TO DREAM: AN ADVENT & EPIPHANY JOURNEY

This Advent, our church family is stepping into a season of holy imagination. In a world where trust feels fragile and divisions often pull us apart, Advent invites us to remember that God meets us in every longing, every question, and every hope we carry. Our new Advent–Epiphany series, *Dare to Dream*, asks us to reclaim the courage to imagine a world made whole—rooted in the visions of Isaiah, the songs of Mary, and the stories of those who welcomed Jesus into the world.

Rather than rushing toward Christmas, we'll move through the season with intention, listening to the ancient voices who dared to believe that God's dream for humanity was bigger than fear, violence, or despair. Each week centers on a biblical figure whose life opens a window into God's unfolding story of hope, peace, joy, love, and courageous faith.

To help us walk more deeply through this season, we've created a full *Dare to Dream Daily Devotional Companion*. This devotional mirrors our weekly themes and includes:

- A daily Scripture reading (NRSVUE)
- A thoughtfully written reflection
- A spiritual practice for the day
- Three guiding questions
- A personal prayer

The devotional companion is designed to meet you wherever you are - whether you're longing for quiet reflection, seeking a pattern to ground your day, or hoping to connect more intentionally with the meaning of Advent. Families, small groups, individuals, and even friends reading together from afar will find this devotional to be a rich and grounding resource through the season.

As we *Dare to Dream* together, may this season awaken your imagination, strengthen your faith, and remind you that God's dream for the world - and for you - is still unfolding. We hope you'll join us for worship, for the devotional journey, and for the shared hope that Advent brings to our community.
