THINK ABOUT IT THIS WEEK

This week, we take a closer look at two verses in Leviticus that have been misused to harm LGBTQ+ people. These verses include a word often translated as "abomination", but the Hebrew word doesn't mean what we've been told it means. *Toevah* refers to something culturally taboo or ritually unclean, like eating shellfish or mixing fabrics, not to something inherently sinful.

lesus invites us to reframe our understanding of holiness as love in action, mercy, and justice - not purity or exclusion. Holiness is about the way we treat one another, especially those the world pushes to the margins.

Reflection Questions:

- Have I ever accepted an interpretation of Scripture that was shaped more by fear than love?
- Where have I seen the Church confuse holiness with control or conformity?
- What does it look like for me to live a life that's "set apart" by compassion?

A Prayer for the Week: God of mercy and justice, open our hearts to the beauty of Your Word and the truth of Your love. Help us let go of harmful interpretations and embrace holiness rooted in grace. Teach us to see one another as sacred, not shameful. May our faith make space, not fences. Amen.

Final Thought: True holiness doesn't exclude—it embraces. It doesn't gatekeep—it gathers. To be set apart in Christ is to be set apart for love.

COMING NEXT WEEK: "UNNATURAL?"

We'll take a closer look at Paul's intent, his use of rhetorical tradition, and the deeper message that unfolds from Romans 1 through 3. Spoiler: Paul wasn't condemning same sex love or relationships - he was confronting idolatry and calling a divided community toward unity in Christ.

This series isn't about rewriting Scripture - it's about reading it faithfully. Come discover a gospel that's bigger, braver, and more inclusive than we've been taught to believe.
